OBJECTS OF THE NATIONAL POPPY TRUST

Objects of the Trust

- 2.1 The principal charitable objects of the Trust are as follows ("the Objects"):
 - (a) To provide for any Service Personnel, their Spouses and Dependents (including Spouses and Dependents who survive or who have survived Service Personnel), in need including without limitation the provision of welfare and medical assistance, irrespective of any connection with the RSA or not;
 - (b) To receive and/or give effect to the trusts and funds set out in Schedule 1 to this Deed and where appropriate to act as trustee for any such trust and administer any such fund provided it is for charitable purposes;
 - To act as trustee for any trust or fund whose purposes are consistent with the purposes of this Deed;
 - To receive monies and other property bequeathed to or otherwise transferred for the benefit of the RSA or Service Personnel, their Spouses and Dependents;
 - To receive, hold and deal with memorabilia of significance to the veteran, service or community at large;
 - (f) The advancement of education including without limitation the provision of assistance to youth organisations and the provision of educational scholarships and grants; and
 - (g) The relief of poverty or hardship and such other charitable purposes within New Zealand as are recognised by the laws of New Zealand.
- 2.2 The Trust Fund shall be applied by the Trustees exclusively for charitable purposes within New Zealand as set out in the Objects and it is declared that the provisions and effect of clauses 2.1 and 2.2 shall not be altered negatived or otherwise modified on a basis which would result in the Trust ceasing to be for charitable purposes within New Zealand.

SCHEDULE ONE

The following Trusts and Funds are to held, administered and distributed by the Trust for the stated purposes:

- Mary M De Vere Mills Trust for the benefit of blind and maimed soldiers of New Zealand:
- Matthew Routley Trust to provide for the assistance of blind servicemen;
- P J Rusden Fund to provide welfare assistance to ex-service personnel and their dependents in need;
- L Le Noury Trust To provide for servicemen of World War One who through their service have lost their sight.
- H T Lumsden Trust to be used to assist Dunkirk Veterans.
- W R Worthington Trust to provide for the benefit of blinded ex-servicemen or exservicewomen and/or their dependents, or for the benefit any organisation established for the benefit of blinded ex-servicemen or ex-servicewomen and/or their dependents;
- D McIntyre Trust to provide for the general welfare purposes of the Royal New Zealand Returned and Services Association;
- Air Force Trust Fund to provide for the relief of stress or need (actual or potential)
 of past and present members of the RNZAF, and their widows, children and other
 dependants;
- 9. Waikanae RSA Trust to provide primarily for the benefit of ex-service RSA personnel and dependents residing within the Waikanae area, including Reikorangi and Peka Peka. The fund capital may be used for this purpose at the discretion of the Trustees, and in the absence of demand for grants for the primary purpose the Trustees may also make grants to organisations whose aims or activities are deemed compatible with those of the RSA;
- Owen R Gatman Memorial Trust to assist returned servicemen and women and their families to gain better access to essential medical services.
- Wellington South RSA Trust to provide for:
 - a) the general welfare or benefit of the interim beneficiaries named in Schedules One and Two to the Trust Deed of the Wellington South RSA Trust dated 23rd January 2003, who are in need of financial support and assistance; and
 - to provide for the relief, assistance and support of past and present servicemen/ women in need, including through disablement, sickness or otherwise, or their dependants or descendants in need, who are resident for the time being in the Wellington provincial district.
